HUD landlords are allowed to choose whether or not to implement nonsmoking policies, despite HUD's repeated notices encouraging landlords to implement non-smoking policies based on the '06 Surgeon General's Report. Thus the most vulnerable nonsmoking populations of disabled, elderly, and low income tenants are forced against their will to live in units contaminated with 2nd hand smoke that endanger their health and safety. These populations' health care costs are paid by taxpayer funded Medicare and Medicaid. Annual health care costs in NY from 2nd hand smoke are about \$263 million; while citizens' state /federal taxes to cover smoking caused government costs are \$6.3 billion (\$894/household). Nonsmoking tenants bear the health consequences and taxpayers bear the double financial costs (sick tenants' health care costs as well as their rents) while landlords become wealthier. Please change this! Consider developing legislation to force landlords receiving HUD assistance to provide safe living conditions for nonsmokers or pay the resulting smoking-caused costs.

There are a number of state legislation in favor of coops pending for long time(some even for 10 years). These bills have never even discussed at the Housing Committees of Assembly and Senate. All the conversations are going about rental, and rental, and again rental, and rental. Attorney General office says it's not their authority. There are no state agency we can come with complaints and for assistance to. Practically, around 1 million state citizens are left without any attention from the state government. It was the same situation when you were NYS Attorney General. Since you as NYS Governor have right for legislative initiative and also in charge of all state agencies, we ask you the following: 1. Promote pending legislation in favor of coop shareholders (we can provide you with list of pending bills). 2. Using your right for legislative initiative, submit a package of new legislation in favor of coop shareholders. The first time it was decreased by 5 dollars and several years later the 5 dollars was reinstated due to a lack of providers. While requirements, paperwork & the cost of doing business have grown exponentially reimbursement is the same as it was in 1989. The small business I had worked for 15 of the past 22 yrs. was forced to close its doors in 2004. I am now a private practitioner. I am responsible for funding my health insurance, malpractice insurance, license fee, NY required continuing education & the full 15% for Social Security. I work in a rural, underserved community. I love my work & am dedicated to the children and families I serve whose needs are so great but there is nothing left to pare down. To ensure the needs of our most vulnerable citizens are met I am asking that you examine closely the reimbursement system for early intervention providers and consider the true cost in lost potential if we are simply unable to continue our work in NY state.

I have been harassed over the past few months from the [REDACTED] office as they insist on checking if I am remarried, I keep sending them my marriage license, we were married for 5 [REDACTED] years, I was gravely insulted. Now they have no service Record for him? I do not have a VSO to help my claim, who is [REDACTED]? No one can call the MANAGER, A [REDACTED], (I can call you) I have tried, [REDACTED] has tried. The paper work goes on and on I now have between my husband and myself, 29 Form letters stating they are looking into my case. I am sure your office and Governor Cuomo have no idea of this incompetence, ineptitude and incapability of personnel to handle claims in a responsible and adequate time frame. No wonder one million vets are waiting. The Veterans Administration is the Nightmare of the returning Veteran and their family. To Add insult to injury, I was told and given in writing that the V.A. would contribute [REDACTED] towards the cremation. THIS TOO HAS NOT HAPPENED, AND I MAY BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THIS AMOUNT OF MONEY. Please, Mr. Kraus, I do not want to contact Governor Cuomo, or the Press, or even Bill O'Reilly? I don't want to cause problems. I am not the V.A. just a struggling widow whose husband gave his life for our country and I only ask what is due me due to his death.
