Project Name	Project Description	Award
Improve the Walkability and Streetscape of Oliver Street	Implement sidewalk and crosswalk enhancements, bump outs, installation of green space, increased pedestrian-scale lighting and other amenities to improve the walkability and appearance of Oliver Street.	\$1,500,000
Develop a Mixed-Use Building at 122 Webster Street	Develop a two-story mixed-use residential/commercial complex with apartments and first floor commercial storefronts.	\$1,360,000
Update and Expand the Riviera Theatre	Modernize and expand the National Register-listed Riviera Theatre, a downtown anchor since 1926. This 6,000+ square foot expansion will include new ADA restrooms, concession area, box office, and artists' merchandise area.	\$1,200,000
Implement Placemaking Improvements	Improve the landscaping, infrastructure and amenities at Charles R. Fleischmann Park; enhance and update Webster and Main Street streetscape; install electric car charging stations and enhance Manhattan Street parking lot.	\$1,000,000
Renovate 27 Main Street	Convert a vacant former furniture store into a commercial prep kitchen, a seasonal ice cream shop/restaurant, and multiple retail spaces.	\$1,000,000
Revitalize 78 Bridge Street	Develop public access to the waterfront on Tonawanda Island.	\$750,000
Establish the Commercial Property Improvement Grant Program	Create a grant program to address small-scale projects and underutilized buildings within the DRI area.	\$630,000
Rebuild 211 Main Street as a Professional Services Incubator	Remediate a brownfield site and construct an office building that will be an incubator for landscape, engineering, and construction-related businesses seeking a collaborative work environment.	\$549,000
Construct a New Apartment Complex at 10 Goundry Street	Demolish an existing structure and replace it with a residential apartment complex.	\$525,000
Improve the Railroad Museum of the Niagara Frontier	Enhance and improve the pedestrian and visitor experience at the museum.	\$470,000
Rehabilitate 230 Oliver Street	Convert an historic building into a mixed-use property with commercial and residential units.	\$250,000
Restore the Allan Herschell Company Complex Music Room	Restore a portion of the Allan Herschell Company Complex, which collapsed in 1995. Restoration will include a new music room connected to the rest of the complex.	\$210,000
Create a Public River Walk at 624 River Road	Construct a 300-foot walkway along the Niagara River for public access to the waterfront and connection to the existing bike trail along River Road.	\$156,000
Upgrade 235/239 Oliver Street	Upgrade low-income apartment units.	\$100,000
