

Pedestrian Safety Action Plan Funding on Local Roads

A total of \$3.44 million in pedestrian safety funding has been allotted to localities in the **Capital Region**, including:

- \$1.49 million to the city of Albany, Albany County, for pedestrian signal installation and crosswalk upgrades along multiple corridors
- \$1.06 million to the city of Schenectady, Schenectady County, to upgrade pedestrian facilities at 10 signalized intersections
- \$500,000 to the city of Rensselaer, Rensselaer County, to upgrade multiple signalized intersections
- \$400,000 to the town of Clifton Park, Saratoga County, to upgrade multiple signalized intersections along Clifton Park Center

A total of \$1.23 million has been allotted to pedestrian safety projects in the **Mohawk Valley**, including:

- \$570,000 to the city of Utica, Oneida County, for multiple pedestrian facility upgrades
- \$660,000 to the city of Gloversville, Fulton County, for multiple pedestrian facility improvements

A total of \$2.13 million in pedestrian safety funding has been allotted to localities **Central New York**, including:

- \$250,000 to the city of Cortland, Cortland County, for multiple pedestrian signal upgrades
- \$1.63 million to the city of Syracuse, Onondaga County, for pedestrian safety intersection improvements
- \$250,000 to Onondaga County for pedestrian crossing improvements

A total of \$3.52 million in pedestrian safety funding has been allotted to localities in the **Finger Lakes**, including:

- \$2.35 million to the city of Rochester, Monroe County
- \$1.17 million to Monroe County

A total of \$4.79 million has been allotted for pedestrian safety projects in **Western New York**, including:

- \$2.04 million to the city of Buffalo, Erie County
- \$769,000 to the city of Niagara Falls, Niagara County
- \$301,000 to the town of Amherst, Erie County
- \$304,000 to the town of Cheektowaga, Erie County
- \$350,000 to Erie County
- \$375,000 to the city of North Tonawanda, Niagara County
- \$330,000 to the city of Olean, Cattaraugus County
- \$315,000 to the town of Tonawanda, Erie County

A total of \$1.16 million has been allotted for pedestrian safety projects in the **North Country**, including:

- \$581,000 to the city of Watertown, Jefferson County for pedestrian signal improvements
- \$576,000 to the city of Plattsburgh, Clinton County for pedestrian signal improvements

A total of \$8.32 million has been allotted for pedestrian safety projects in the **Mid-Hudson region**, including:

- \$2.43 million to the city of Poughkeepsie, Dutchess County
- \$775,000 to Westchester County for upgrades at signalized intersections and uncontrolled crosswalks
- \$2.54 million to the city of New Rochelle, Westchester County, for pedestrian signal improvements
- \$596,000 to the village of Port Chester, Westchester County
- \$547,000 to the town of Ramapo, Rockland County
- \$370,000 to the village of Nyack, Rockland County
- \$530,000 to the city of Kingston, Ulster County, for pedestrian safety at intersections
- \$530,000 to Orange County

A total of \$2.69 million has been allotted for pedestrian safety projects in the **Southern Tier**, including:

- \$489,000 to the city of Binghamton, Broome County
- \$622,000 to the village of Endicott, Broome County
- \$985,000 to the city of Elmira, town of Big Flats and village of Horseheads, all in Chemung County, to support the Elmira Urban Area County Pedestrian Safety Project
- \$590,000 to the city of Ithaca, Tompkins County

A total of \$12.78 million has been allotted for pedestrian safety projects on **Long Island**, including:

- \$2.78 million to Suffolk County for locations in the towns of Huntington, Islip, Brookhaven, Smithtown and Babylon, for Phase 1 of Suffolk County's Pedestrian Signal Safety Improvement project
- \$4.13 million to Suffolk County for locations in the towns of Huntington, Islip, Brookhaven, Smithtown, Riverhead and Southampton, for Phase 2 of Suffolk County's Pedestrian Signal Safety Improvement project
- \$330,000 to Nassau County for a project in the village of Great Neck Plaza in the town of North Hempstead for curb extensions at the intersection of South Middle Neck Road and Barstown Road
- \$4.22 million to Nassau county for locations in the towns of Hempstead, Oyster Bay and North Hempstead, the village of Freeport in the town of Hempstead, and the city of Glen Cove, for safety improvements at uncontrolled crosswalks
- \$1.32 million to the town of Brookhaven, Suffolk County
